Will we build a new building? Where will it be located? Will we rent? Will we buy and renovate a building? What about our furniture? What, what, what? From the Chapter of Rose Croix. Happy September Brethren. I ran across some information the other day that I thought was interesting and pertains to the ole Rosy Cross. The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is celebrated every year on September 14th. According to tradition the true cross was discovered in 326 by Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine during a pilgrimage she made to Jerusalem. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre was then built at the site of the discovery. The feast recalls three events: the <u>finding of the True Cross</u> ; the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem in AD 629 by the Byzantine emperor <u>Heraclius</u> after it had fallen into the hands of the Persian emperor <u>Chosroes II</u> in the AD 614 Sasanian conquest of Jerusalem.
