#### Brethren:

At our Stated Meeting in June, sixty-nine of our Brethren were present and after hearing the "Motion to Sell" our Temple Building, along with a brief report on the study conducted into the vitality and solvency of our Valley, a unanimous vote was received to sell. This is a very bold step to take but one that needs to be implemented as clearly revealed by the three committees formed to conduct the study and their respective findings.

While we are all very appreciative of the significant amount of time and effort expended by our Brethren who made up the sub-committees that conducted the study of our Valley, the real work will now begin. Many questions are in the minds of us all; When will the building be sold? Where will we meet? What about the Blue Lodges who meet in our building? What about the Childhood Language Center? Will we build a new building? Where will it be located? Will we rent? Will we buy and renovate a building? What about our furniture? What, what, what? All are excellent questions and we are in the process of establishing a number of committees to answer all of your questions and many more as we move forward.

As a precursor to a full-fledged plan for the future I have established three (3) sub-committees with specific charges to each. Keep in mind that this is preliminary, yet very important work that needs to be performed. The sub-committees are as follows:

- "What Should Future Building Look Like" Chaired by Ill. Claude A. "Buddy" Bass
- "Disposition of Valley Furniture, Library, Backdrops & Artifacts Chaired By Rick Kidd, 32<sup>nd</sup>
- "S.R. Childhood Language Center" Co-Chaired by Ill. Sam Dunn & Rt.Wor. Doug Jones, KCCH

The Chairmen of the above sub-committees have a number of our brethren assigned and if you are interested in severing on one of them please contact the Chairman and offer your services as I am confident that they will be readily received.

I thank each and every one of you who attended our June meeting and voted with your keen minds and not with your hearts as no one, not the first single member, could say that we are happy to be selling our building but we all

know that it is the correct action to take. With everyone's support and backing the Richmond Valley will end up in a much better place both physically and fiscally and with an even brighter future.

A number of you have inquired as to when the L.M.I.P. for Scottish Rite will be reinstated? The good news is that the Supreme Council, while not having taken a collective position on this as of yet, our S.G.I.G., Ill. and M.W. Jim Cole will approve a Valley in his Orient reinstating the program on a case by case basis and with a minimum number of steps required. Your Executive Council will be discussing this at our July meeting and we will keep you informed.

The summer has not been a quiet time for the Richmond Valley. We have faced some difficult decisions head on all the while looking to the horizon for the promise of a new beginning......yes, we embrace the past and we especially remember the sacrifice of those who walked before us but we also know the path ahead is filled with promise if we boldly take the next step—and with a clear and open mind—dedication, determination—and an unwavering commitment to Masonic values—look behind the door waiting to be opened. At our June Stated meeting the Brethren approved the sale of our Scottish Rite Building and Grounds. After a period of serious, heartfelt discussion, the affirmative vote was unanimous. By letter dated, June 29, 2018, the SGIG, James D. Cole, 33°, affirmed the action to sell the building.

Now the hard work really begins! First, we have to sell the building. At this point, we've had interest but no offers. We have to decide where we are moving to and just what we want our new building to look like. Many questions have to be answered. Will we take on new construction or will we repurpose an existing building to meet our needs? Assuming we want to generate an income stream through rentals, we have to consider an assessable location, as well as a facility that is attractive and functional for rental clients all the while fulfilling our Masonic needs. Of course, there's the budget, how much can we afford? And finally, deciding what to do with the furniture in our current building and all the other stuff we have some of which still has a useful purpose, some things are historic, and other items, well, they have seen better days and need to find a new home. To move this work forward our Personal Representative has formed four committees: Sale & Future Home of the Richmond Valley; What Should Our Future Building Look Like; Disposition of Valley Furniture, Library, Backdrops and Artifacts; and, the fourth committee will coordinate

all matters relating to the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Center. If you are interested in working with any of these committees, please contact the Valley Secretary.

Each of you are important to the Valley, and "as the length of your cable tow will permit," please be present, be involved, you are our future! Remember this, "Success isn't always about greatness. It's about consistency. Consistent hard work leads to success. Greatness will come."

# **FEAST OF TISHRI**


