Respected Brethren of the Richmond Valley,

Would you know what to do if a loved one were to drop from cardiac arrest? Well... we know to call 911, but then SOMEONE should start CPR. What if you were alone? Would you know what to do?

Do you give 30 chest compressions, then two rescue breaths? Or was is 15 chest compressions, and two rescue breaths? Over the last 5 years, the American Heart Association realized that the guidelines for CPR was overly complicated, and that the current research on cardiac arrest began showing less of a need for the traditional "rescue breaths".

So what is the current guideline for CPR? It is now an easy two-step process:

1 - Call 911

2 - Push Hard & Fast

This simple form of "hands-free CPR" can triple the victim's chances of survival! After you call 911, you just need to perform chest compressions at the rate of 100-120 beats per minute. You simply continue the chest compressions until EMS or First Responders arrive. There is no longer any need to stop CPR in order to perform rescue breathing. We must all realize that CPR is nothing for us to fear. Rather, it is an easy-to-use tool that can save the life of a loved one!

What is with the Scottish Rite Temple building?

Latter part of 2015 - Our HVAC system was reviewed because of being 48 years old. Brother William K. Lampøs firm was contacted to do a survey and plan an upgrade. This was to include change from an analog to an electronic digital system. Goal was to revamp the cooling system and switch from electric strip heat to boiler fired warm water. It was decided to do this major enhancement in three stages. Brother Lamp did extensive work with existing drawings, and site evaluation.

2016, the findings were a real shock. When the new roof was put installed, some sprayed on asbestos above the lighting bridge was knocked loose. The lighting bridge is in the rear above the auditorium. F&R (Froehling & Robertson) were contracted to evaluate the entire building for asbestos. Armed with the proper information, WACO construction was employed to do the asbestos abatement. The auditorium was closed, sealed and the work began.

2017, OSHA came in to inspect the work and process. WACO finished the abatement. The entire auditorium was HEPA vacuumed, cleaned and spot lights were reinstalled on the bridge. OSHA signed off on the work. F&R screened the air, checked all areas and certified the air quality.

April 2017, the auditorium was put back into service.

Work has not yet begun on the HVAC upgrade. The asbestos abatement has used most of the phase one approved funds. We are regrouping before an upgrade can occur.
