CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

“So beginning with the fifteenth day of the seventh month, after you have gathered the crops of the land, celebrate the festival to the Lord for seven days; the first day is a day of Sabbath rest, and the eighth day also is a day of Sabbath rest. Live in temporary shelters for seven days. All native-born Israelites are to live in such shelters so your descendants will know that I had the Israelites live in temporary shelters when I brought them out of Egypt. I am the Lord your God.”

You may not be familiar with this Leviticus scripture, but it is the foundation from which developed the Feast of Tishri that we celebrated in September. What do you know about the Feast of Tishri? Until I again began working through the Master Craftsman program lately, all that I knew is that we have a sumptuous dinner and make toasts to our country and various Scottish Rite and Masonic dignitaries. Tishri is the Babylonian name of that seventh month in which occurred the harvest festivals, and it has now become the first month of the Jewish civil calendar in which is celebrated their most important holidays.

About 450 years after God issued this command, King Solomon dedicated his temple to coincide with both Abraham's birthday and the harvest festival – forming what is now known as the Feast of the Tabernacles. Because of its association with the dedication of the temple, Scottish Rite Masonry has now adopted and renamed it as the Feast of Tishri. It is the most important Scottish Rite dinner of the year. That is the background of how it developed, but what is its Masonic significance to us?

First, it reminds us that just as Solomon built the physical temple, and our Lodges are based on this model, so we Masons are dedicated to building moral and spiritual temples in the hearts of men. Second, just as Solomon's name means peace and God selected him to build the temple because he was a man of immense wisdom and peace, so we are to work towards establishing a lasting peace and brotherly love among all men and nations. Third, just as Solomon utilized King Hiram of Tyre, men from Gebal, and other foreigners to build the temple, so are we to welcome those of other faiths and nationalities to our fellowship. Finally, and perhaps most important to us, Solomon established the temple as a dwelling place for God, where He could communicate with his people and they commune with Him.

So, the last lesson of the Feast of Tishri could be a reminder that the spirit of God dwells within us, that he is present to guide and lead us, and that he will never leave or forsake us, as he promised to Joshua. As it says in the Scottish Rite Ritual Monitor and Guide, “The Feast of Tishri thus epitomizes the character, principles and purposes of Scottish Rite Masonry, all being consistent with the dictates of the God who spake it into existence”.

By the time you receive this article, we will be preparing for our long awaited Fall Reunion, again different from anything we have ever witnessed. However, it will be wonderful to add approximately 20 new Masters of the Royal Secret to our Valley membership rolls. We will still be under social distancing regulations at this time so there will be limited audience and no food involved.

This may be a first and last time for a couple of reasons. First, this is a completely new way of conveying the degrees established by The Supreme Council, because of COVID-19. Second, this may be the last time that degrees are conveyed in our current building (more to follow).

It is times like this that we need our membership to remain strong and faithful to our Valley. We have missed the opportunity to raise funds for our beloved Childhood Language Center because we had to cancel our annual CLC Golf Tournament and our annual CLC Spaghetti Dinner. Both contributed greatly to the treatment of our deserving patients. The need for help for the Language Center continues to grow and our ability to raise funds diminishes. As always, there are many rumors circulating about the sale of our Temple. I will attempt an explanation. If you have questions, please feel free to call. If I do not answer, please leave a message, as I would love to talk to you. I can be reached at (804) 370-1861.

A few months ago, we were approached with a letter of intent (LOI) to purchase our property that has been for sale since July 2018. Your Trustees reviewed the LOI, made several changes and sent it back to the agent for the prospective buyer. The LOI has been passed around and they finally have come to a working agreement giving us everything we requested. The next step is for the LOI to become a purchase agreement. Once the purchase agreement is presented to the Trustees, reviewed by a Real Estate Attorney and returned to the purchaser, they will have 90 days for a Feasibility study. At the end of 90 days, they can continue with the contract or decline the sale. If they wish to proceed, we will have a closing date of January 15, 2021. We are under a confidentiality agreement so we cannot discuss the name of the possible purchaser or any of the financial aspects of this agreement. We have secured a meeting place starting in January within 5 miles of our current location for our Stated Meetings.

So, the short answer is 'no', the building has not been sold, but may be soon. If the building sells, the CLC will be able to remain in place and operate as normal until we have a new location for our permanent home and they are able to join us.

Again, my Brethren, I beg for your continued support and prayers that our Valley will remain a strong center of Masonic Learning and a fountain of prosperity for our children. May God continue to bless you, our Rite and this great United States of America.


